Justin M. Lewis, was born and raised in the Washington D.C area. He began his career in dance by joining Tappers with Attitude Youth Ensemble at age 10, a national touring youth group from ages 10-18. After graduation, he attended Columbia College of Chicago for Performing Arts management and went on to teach and choreograph at over 100+ studios around the country. He was the Artistic Director of Rhythmic Circus productions and toured nationally and internationally with shows, "Feet Don't Fail Me Now" and "Holiday Shuffle". Lewis also performed at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival in Scotland as well as Super Bowl 52 with Rhythmic Circus. He was a co-choreographer and dancer of the JaM project who appeared on season 2 of "World of Dance" on NBC, as well as America's Got Talent. While a part of the JaM Project, he performed on stages such as Radio City Music Hall, Kennedy Center, Apollo Theatre, Wolf Trap just to name a few. Mr. Lewis was the choreographer of "The Hot Shoe Shuffle" at the Wick Theatre and the Winner of Best Choreography for the Carbonell Awards for Theatre in Florida. His choreography has been seen on "So You Think You Can Dance", Fred Astaire Awards in NYC, Young Choreographers Festival, World of Dance (NBC) and excerpts on Broadway. Lewis had been privileged with teaching and inspiring dancers all over the world. He and his student Luke Spring had a viral video hit over YouTube and Facebook with over 70 million views within a week. Mr. Lewis has also taught at the collegiate level at Shenandoah University as a professor in Musical Theatre and Dance.
